# **Program Notes**

# **RAINFOREST SUITE** by Dianne Davies

The *Toucan and Macaw*. The white-throated toucan's bill is typically 5½–7 inches long with total length of 21 to 24 inches and weighs 22 ounces. This bird delivers their call with a jerk of their bill and the tail upward with each yelp. The low register dampened strings mimic their croak. Toucans are endangered due to deforestation and poaching. The Spix macaw is a medium-size parrot weighing about 11 ounces, smaller than most of the large macaws and its plumage is various shades of blue. The high register of dampened strings mimic their squawk. Loss of habitat is largely responsible for the decline of the Spix's macaw, but the illegal bird trade has driven this parrot to extinction in the wild.

The *Golden Poison Dart Frog* grows to be about 2 inches long, yet the poison from just one of these frogs can kill ten grown men. They get the name from the fact that Native people of South America use their poison to coat their blow darts for hunting and combat. This piece illustrates the deceptive beauty of this frog's radiant skin and yet the suspense of danger. 130 species of poison dart frogs are extinct and 400 are on the endangered list. The reason for their decline is the loss of habitat.

The *Three-toed Sloth* adult measures 23 inches long and weighs about 8 to 9 pounds. Sloths are the slowest animal moving only 1.5 miles an hour on land. Because they are so slow, algae grows on their fur and provides camouflage. This piece depicts the slow crawling movement of the sloth. The strumming of the resonating strings is the wind in the trees. The Three-toed sloth is on the endangered species list due to deforestation, loss of habitat and the illegal pet trade.

The Jaguar is a compact, well-muscled animal and is the largest cat native to the Americas and the third largest in the world, after the tiger and lion. Their fur is covered with rosettes or spots for camouflage which vary in their shapes between individual jaguars from one to several dots. The adult Jaguar weighs between 110 and 250 pounds and 5 to 6 feet long. This music displays the Jaguar stalking prey, the chase and perhaps capture. You decide what happens at the end. Jaguars are still hunted for their attractive fur and ranchers kill them to defend their livestock. It is believed that only 15,000 jaguars remain in the wild.

#### CRADLE SONG by John DeRuntz

A gently rocking lullaby written for a young lady whose piano technique had been sufficiently developed to the level required by the piece.

#### AURORA by Liz Nedela

Imagine an aurora in the night sky. The pianist paints a musical picture with this dreamy whole tone creation, wandering through the sky, shaping patterns and then letting them float away.

#### STARLIGHT by Timothy Arliss O'Brien

This beautifully simple melody falls across the keys. The harmonies and melodies are falling starlight under the fingers.

## **RUFFLES** by Jan Mittelstaedt

*Ruffles* opens with arpeggiated augmented chords. As a child, I loved to play pieces that were made up of arpeggios, played hand over hand. But, usually the music I played was made up of primary chords. So, I decided to write a piece that contained augmented and diminished triads as well as major and minor ones. This piece is part of a collection, "Fabric and Frills" that was published in 1994 by Boston Music Co.

# THE LION AND THE MERMAID by Jan Mittelstaedt

My inspiration was a statue, Merlion, which is part lion and part fish. It stands at the opening of the Singapore River.

# OVERNIGHT TRAINRIDE by Timothy Arliss O'Brien

Overnight Trainride is a composition on acceleration. The dark brooding melody follows the performers, instigating them to speed across the landscape.

# **PRELUDE NO. 2 in B-flat Major** by John DeRuntz

Chords in the treble clef are accompanied by scale work in the bass suggesting some kind of unrest. However, it concludes with an uplifting finish.

# DISTANT CHURCH PIANO by Timothy Arliss O'Brien

*Distant Church Piano* is an exploration in arpeggiated harmonies and blending sound together. This short lullaby-esque melody soothes the heart and gives a moment for meditation.

# THE CANONETTE in G Minor by Gary Noland

*The Canonette,* composed in 1998, is the first in a set of five short pieces for piano. Salted with spiky dissonances and cross relations, it is a canon at the octave until the formalistic pattern is broken just prior to its conclusion with a cadential passage that is intentionally overblown for a piece of such brevity.

# CROSSING PATHS by Ted Clifford

The title is suggestive of a walk through the neighborhood, and this is how the piece feels to me. It is also suggested in the recapitulation, where the RH theme and LH accompaniment switch places. The overall development of this piece involves a melody in the RH and ostinato-like accompaniment in the LH. The theme is repeated with gradual harmonic changes and extensions to both parts, culminating in a longer running melody. Finally, the parts switch registers.

# GENIUS by Timothy Arliss O'Brien

*Genius* takes the performer across the keys of the piano, creating a type of intellect. This song is a study in movement and dynamics. Creating a dramatic spar between major and minor harmonics, this song teaches intellect.

# AUTUMN IN ANN ARBOR by Jan Mittelstaedt

The inspiration for this piece came from a visit to Ann Arbor to see my Aunt. The beautiful leaves and clear, cool day were so refreshing to us, as we had been living in Houston, Texas for a couple of years.

#### SHIMMER by Liz Nedela

This "audience teaser" is fun to play. It begins with a chord that is held by the sostenuto pedal while both hands play a "shimmery" melody in the high register; all are transposed, and inside-piano patterns are added, which can instead be played on the keys. (Wait for the "real ending.")

#### GRIMPROVISATION, Op. 38 by Gary Noland

I composed this piece on New Years Day, 1994. I premiered it on a Seventh Species concert at Smith Recital Hall, Western Oregon University, on January 22nd, 1995.

#### PENTA-MOODS by Liz Nedela

*Melody on Miyako Bushi* is a Japanese Hemitonic Pentatonic Scale that accentuates a half-step – something we don't usually hear in pentatonic. The Secondo is a minimalist pattern, while the Primo sings a melancholic emotional melody.

*"The Chase" on the Man Gong*—One explanation of "man gong" is ca 15<sup>th</sup> century and is an antique tuning, which we can only approximate. This playful piece utilizes a minimalist pattern recurring between "chases" by primo and secondo. It invites chorography between duet partners!

*Penta-Moods Variations* utilizes the Blues Minor and Man Gong pentatonic scales, (believed to be the same scale but interpreted differently in these variations), adding portions of diatonic scales, major 7<sup>th</sup> and dominant 7<sup>th</sup> chords, influences of jazz harmonies, sprinkled with slow melodic motives and fast, playful contrasts; and also includes a sentimental ballad. Playful interplay between Primo and Secondo invites integrative interpretation from the duet partners, especially giving it a splashy ending!

# **Composer Biographies**

#### **Ted Clifford**

Ted Clifford has over 20 years of experience as a performer and composer. Growing up in St. Cloud, Minnesota, he attended college there and studied with Alvaro Bertand and Tom Allen. After travels in Europe and Central Asia, Ted continued to study jazz performance, and composition, under Art Lande, David Friesen, and Tomas Svoboda. A third stream of eclecticism has involved performance of arrangements of Frank Zappa. Ted has released an album of jazz originals (Azir), and his compositions and arrangements have been performed as far as Germany and Cuba. He is currently serving as President of Cascadia Composers.

#### **Dianne Davies**

**Dianne Davies** received a BA in music from Lewis and Clark College with piano emphasis and K-12 music education certification. Since then, Dianne has taught public and private school music and currently focuses on her family, private piano studio and performing. In February of 2016, she created her own show titled Attachments & Detachments Tragedy to Triumph combining the music of Cascadia Composers with dance, live art and theatre to tell her own transparent story. It has become her passion to share new music with the next generation. As a member of Cascadia Composers, Dianne sought to perform the music of others. After much encouragement, she has started composing piano music for students. Last year she had her first piano compositions played at PSU in the "In Good Hands" concert that connects living composers with young music students

#### John De Runtz

John DeRuntz has written roughly 75 pieces for solo piano in classical, romantic and impressionistic styles. Fifty of his works appear on four albums, Soaring, Fantasia, Reverie and Encore. Jan Mittelstaedt, B.S. in education from Bucknell University, B.A. in music from Marylhurst University and M.M. in composition from The University of Portland, continues to work with her mentor, Dr. Walter Saul. Jan participated in the Ernest Bloch Composers Symposium in 1993, was the Oregon Music Teachers Association Composer of the Year in 1994, has received ASCAP special awards since 1994, and has published piano music. A teacher of piano and composition, Jan has an active studio, is a member of the OMTA piano syllabus adjudicating staff and serves the organization in other ways. In 2017, she received as Honorary State Membership award. Her music has been performed in six states not including two of her student piano pieces which have been performed all over the country in various NFMC Junior Festivals. #### Liz Nedela

Liz Nedela teaches piano and composition in Vancouver WA. She is fond of ethnic, modal and early music, melodic line, counterpoint, and contemporary techniques and weaves these aspects into her compositions. She writes music in many genres, instruments and voice, completing commissions from music teachers organizations, churches, orchestras, chamber music, Women's Music festivals, art galleries, and for concert music and special events, most recently: Portland Polonia, in celebration of the Poland Independence Centenary. She has earned an MM in composition (winning a Composer Showcase award and scholarships), and a BA and MEd with focus on piano, composition, English, Theater, music and the gifted and at risk student, devising a program for teaching composition. She has served as the Montana State and the Northwest Division chair of composition for MTNA (Music Teachers National Association), active in Montana Music Institute, founded Birchwood Performing Arts and Birchwood Players (MN), and many summer camps. In 2014, Liz was awarded the WSMTA (Washington chapter of MTNA) Composer of the Year, resulting in Penta-Moods, a study in pentatonic modes. She is an active member of Cascadia Composers and other music organizations, and has served as adjudicator in piano and composition.

**Gary Lloyd Noland** (a.k.a. author Dolly Gray Landon & artist Lon Gaylord Dylan) Gary Lloyd Noland grew up in a crowded house shared by ten people on a plot of land three blocks south of UC Berkeley known as People's Park, which has distinguished itself as a site of civic unrest since the late 1960s. As an adolescent, Gary lived for a time in Salzburg and Garmisch-Partenkirchen, where he absorbed many musical influences. Having studied with a long roster of acclaimed composers and musicians, he earned his Bachelor's in music from UC Berkeley in 1979, continued studies at the Boston Conservatory, and transferred to Harvard University, where he added to his credits a

Masters and a PhD in Music Composition in 1989. Gary's catalogue consists of hundreds of works, which include piano, vocal, chamber, experimental, and electronic pieces; fulllength plays in verse, "chamber novels," and other text pieces; as well as graphically notated scores. His award-winning chamber novel JAGDLIED for Narrator, Musicians, Pantomimists, Dancers & Culinary Artists was listed as one of the "Top 10 Books" of 2018. Gary's compositions have been performed and broadcast (including on NPR) in many locations throughout the United States, as well as in Europe, Asia, and Australia. He founded the Seventh Species concert series in San Francisco in 1990 and, for a period of 23 years, produced well over 50 concerts of contemporary classical music on the West Coast. Gary has taught music at Harvard, the University of Oregon, and Portland Community College. His musical scores are available from J.W. Pepper, RGM, Sheet Music Plus, and Freeland Publications.
